TEAM CHANGES / COMPETITOR WITHDRAWALS

- Please advise of any competitor/full team withdrawals as soon as possible (ie first thing where known) using the Competitor Withdrawal Form (copy attached to <u>calendar event page</u>; hard copies available at the pool outside the admin control room).
- All teams reporting to marshalling need to complete Final Team Forms. (copy attached to <u>calendar event page</u>; hard copies available at the pool outside admin control room).

MARSHALLING

The Marshalling room will be the main area for marshalling however U11-U14 Line Throw and other 50m events may be marshaled on the pool deck marshalling area

- 1. Competitors should report to the Marshalling & have their name checked off as quickly as possible upon hearing the first marshal call for an event remembering that multiple age/gender groups are likely to be called together.
- 2. If a competitor is racing when a marshalling call for another event is made, the Club must have someone marshall in their absence
- 3. ALL competitors <u>MUST wear a club cap</u> and this be <u>consistent in team events</u> (excl composite teams)
- 4. Once on pool deck, competitors must stay in lane allocated order

OFFICIALS

Should report to the officials briefing (marshalling room) 12.45pm on Saturday & 7.15am on Sunday.

A small refreshment will be offered on the Saturday afternoon. Morning tea & lunch will be provided on Sunday to officials & pool setters. Water fountains are available and all officials and pool setters should bring drink bottles and refill as required.

TIMEKEEPERS

Clubs have been pre-allocated lanes for timekeeping (do not need to be accredited officials) and need to be in place for the duration of each day. Catering is not provided by SLSSA for timekeepers.

WATER SAFETY & RISK MANAGEMENT

The Safety & Emergency Committee will meet prior to the start of the carnival to determine any final procedures regarding water safety and risk management.

Should, at any stage prior to or during competition, there be a credible basis for concluding there is an unreasonable risk of serious injury occurring, the Safety & Emergency Committee and/or appropriate officials shall suspend all or parts of the competition. The Safety & Emergency Committee shall then decide whether to postpone, cancel or relocate all or parts of the competition. Should a risk assessment indicate that part, or all of the competition, not be conducted because of adverse conditions, or another threat, the Competition and Safety and Emergency Committees will again decide whether to postpone or cancel all or parts of the competition.

Further, competitors are to ensure they do not pose a threat to pool water quality as a result of illness and as such, any person/s who have experienced vomiting and/or diarrhoea in the 24 hours prior to the competition should not enter the water.

ILS SANCTIONING

These championships are sanctioned by ILS and, as such, any World Records achieved for ILS recognized events will be recorded and submitted to ILS for processing as per the 2019 Edition (Revised February 2020, January 2021, March 2021 edition.

If any Youth or Open World Records are broken competitors will need to submit to a doping test. Details will be provided to the team manager if this occurs.

EQUIPMENT & UNIFORMS

- Club caps (or swim caps) <u>must</u> be worn and all must be <u>consistent</u> in team events (excluding composite teams).
- SLSSA will supply the Rescue Tubes, Manikins, Bricks and Lines for the use of competitors during competition. Such equipment will comply with the ILS/SLSA specifications.
- All competitors are required to supply their own fins (for specifications for compliance please refer SLSA Surf Sports Manual):
 - o Rubber fins for U11/12/13 athletes
 - o Fibreglass fins for U14 masters athletes
- All competition equipment may be subject to scrutineering checks during the event

MEDAL PRESENTATIONS

Saturday- will be conducted on the grandstand concourse at the conclusion of the program.

Sunday- to be conducted on pool deck while races are occurring where possible and during intervals if required through the day.

Competitors should present promptly (with club caps/uniform) when called.

The presentation of the Pool Rescue State Championship pennant as well as the overall individual pool rescue medals will be made following the conclusion of the event medal presentations & final calculation of pointscores.

Only endorsed SLSSA photographers will be permitted to conduct pool deck photography of presentations & must wear orange media bib. SLSSA Photos will be made available, however a presentation area will be set up on the Grandstand concourse if clubs or parents wish to take photos.

PHOTOGRAPHY

Use of photography from the stands is permitted, however, only endorsed club/SLSSA photographers (max. 1 per Club at any one time & must wear orange media bib) are permitted to take photos within the pool deck area including the presentation area. The event Referee and/or his appointee reserves the right to allocate specific areas on pool deck for photographers to ensure no adverse impact on the event and/or its competitors.



POOL DECK ACCESS

Spectators will NOT be allowed on pool deck level.

Time keepers must go report directly to pool deck and not enter any other area on the pool deck level.

VENUE LOGISTICS

Car Parking

Is available in the adjacent multi-storey car park at no cost and in the surrounding streets. Please do not use the Westfield Shopping Centre car park as this is for their patrons only.

Entrance

A dedicated event entrance will be available, at least for the early part of each day, which is located west of the main entrance to the centre. If arriving after this entrance is closed, please use the centre's main entrance and identify yourself as Surf Life Saving SA event participant as there is no entrance fee.

Seating areas

Competitors, coaches, supporters shall be seated in the main southern stand. Please remove any rubbish.

Food & Drink

Can be brought into the centre, however, commercial fast food, alcohol cans & glassware are not permitted. The venue's café will be open for the duration of the event with a variety of food & drink (coffee, hot food, sandwiches, cold drinks, muffins, ice creams, snacks etc) available for purchase.

<u>Saturday- Café near the main entry will be available till 4pm</u>. Concourse Café will NOT be available at all on Saturday. Sunday- Café on the concourse will be available from 7am.

Toilet & Changeroom facilities

Toilets/showers/changerooms are available at several locations throughout the venue. Please do not leave belongings in these areas.

First Aid

The Centre has First Aid and emergency evacuation procedures. First Aid personnel will be on site for the duration of the event.
