#### **Club Volunteers**

Clubs are to complete their component of the <u>Senior Carnival Officials & Volunteer Roster</u> by 12 noon Thursday 5 January to detail volunteer names & other requirements.

# **Entry Fees**

The carnival entry fee is set at \$17.50 (incl GST) per entered competitor.

Late entry fees may be charged for any entries made after 10am on Thursday 5/1/23 and before close of late entries (8am, Sunday 8/1/23). This fee is set at the entry fee + 100% of entry fee (ie total \$35 incl GST).

Clubs will be invoiced for all entered competitors (including any late entries) following the carnival.

## Eligibility

All eligibility criteria as detailed below MUST be achieved AND showing in Surfguard by the date of the close of entries (Thurs 5 January 2023).

#### Lycra Hi-Vis Vests

The wearing of hi-visibility vests is compulsory for all competitors at this carnival. These can be either fluorescent pink or fluorescent yellow. This requirement extends to craft handlers & Cameron Relay runners.

#### **CLUB REQUIREMENTS**

## 1. Team Manager

- a. Required to attend Team Managers briefing **via Zoom on Thursday 5 Jan at 8pm** (link will be sent to listed Team Managers & Surf Sports Officers closer to the event).
- b. Separate Team Manager/Sweeps briefing will occur in the boat area on the day of event.

#### 2. Officials

Thank you to those officials who have already volunteered for these carnivals. Role allocations have been made accordingly which can be found via the <u>roster</u>

- a. Remaining allocations to be filled by club officials as per rostered allocation (please insert names as appropriate on the roster)
- b. Should wear either an officials shirt (if already have one from previous season) or alternatively sunsmart plain clothing (no club branding). Coloured vests will be available in the designated area for officials to put on over their clothing to denote they are officiating in that particular area
- c. BYO sunsmart hat, water bottle (water will be available in the area to FILL your own drink bottle), sunscreen, clipboard. Those who haven't yet received their officials lanyard pack they will receive these at the carnival.
- d. Morning tea/lunch will be provided but please bring other food if required

## 3. Workparty

Clubs are rostered to undertake work party duties with allocations based on 2020-21 participation numbers. The Clubs required to supply workparty volunteer/s (7.15am – 8.30am for set up + pack up at completion) are:

- COORDINATOR = South Port x 1
- CAN SETTING = South Port
- Central Admin Tent/Area = South Port
- BEACH AREA
  - o Grange x 6
  - o Somerton x 2
- WATER AREAS (Pink + Blue)
  - o West Beach x 6

## 4. Under 14 competitors

- Clubs with Under 14 competitors who have NOT yet completed their Surf Rescue Certificate (SRC)
  are to provide <u>COMPETENT</u> water safety personnel (WSP) with their own Rescue Board in the ratio
  of 1 WSP: 5 competitors.
- These duties can be shared between clubs to ensure the ratio is maintained whilst not overcrowding the water arena with additional craft.
- Please provide details of the number of Under 14s WITHOUT an SRC on the Google Sheets document & ensure your Club meets the above requirements.



## 5. Photographers

- Must have meet the requirements completed the <u>Accreditation Request Form</u> (once per photographer for the season) as per <u>C22057</u> – <u>Carnival Club Photographers 22-23</u>
- The number of photographers per Club is limited to a maximum of 3 at any one time
- A maximum of 1 x photographer per Club in any competition area also applies
- Photographers must SIGN ON at the Carnival Admin tent & will receive their accreditation badge and media vest
- They must then SIGN OUT at completion, returning the badge and vest
- Photographers are to comply with Officials' directives regarding positioning etc

## 6. Shallow Water Rescue personnel

- a. Competent, skilled surf swimmers (BM proficient) who would be called upon to assist should a shallow water rescue occur
- b. List name/s of competent member/s who will be present at the carnival on the volunteer roster (as above)
- c. Will be called for briefing at start of the day

## 7. IRB Water Safety

IRBs – as per <u>Carnival IRB Water Safety Roster</u>, the following Clubs are required to provide 1 x IRB, fully equipped (including fuel and radio), fully operational & competent crew (1 x driver and 1 x crew) who are capable to handle the conditions on the day.

It is strongly encouraged that crews are interchanged during the day - this is the responsibility of the club.

- 2 x South Port
- 1 x Brighton
- 1x Surf Boat Area (Seacliff SLSC to provide driver, crew & radio only).

#### **WATER SAFETY & RISK MANAGEMENT**

The Safety & Emergency Committee will meet prior to the start of the carnival to determine any final procedures regarding water safety and risk management.

Should, at any stage prior to or during competition, there is a credible basis for concluding there is an unreasonable risk of serious injury occurring, the Safety & Emergency Committee and/or appropriate officials shall suspend all or parts of the competition. The Safety & Emergency Committee shall then decide whether to postpone, cancel or relocate all or parts of the competition. Should a risk assessment indicate that part, or all of the competition, not be conducted because of adverse weather or surf conditions, or another threat, the Competition and Safety and Emergency Committees will again decide whether to postpone or cancel all or parts of the competition.
