REMINDERS:

- Recent SLSA policy allows for Under 15 competitors WITH a proficient Bronze Medallion to compete in surf boat events. As this is a Championship event, any such competitors must also meet patrol hour requirements to ensure eligibility.

TEAM CHANGES

Any changes to nominated crews must either involve nominated reserve competitors or have such changes approved by SLSSA prior to the event (ie to validate eligibility with regards to registration, award proficiency and patrol hour requirements).

WATER SAFETY & RISK MANAGEMENT

The Safety & Emergency Committee will meet prior to the start of the carnival to determine any final procedures regarding water safety and risk management.

Should, at any stage prior to or during competition, there is a credible basis for concluding there is an unreasonable risk of serious injury occurring, the Safety & Emergency Committee and/or appropriate officials shall suspend all or parts of the competition. The Safety & Emergency Committee shall then decide whether to postpone, cancel or relocate all or parts of the competition. Should a risk assessment indicate that part, or all of the competition, not be conducted because of adverse weather or surf conditions, or another threat, the Competition and Safety and Emergency Committees will again decide whether to postpone or cancel all or parts of the competition.

Lycra Hi-Vis Vests

The wearing of hi-visibility vests is compulsory for all competitors in water events.

OFFICIALS

Thank you to those officials who have already volunteered for these events. All participating Clubs are expected to provide officials based on number of competitors. Please ensure you share information regarding the event with such volunteers.

WORKPARTY

As per all surf boat carnivals/areas, all participating Clubs are expected to assist with set up and pack up of equipment relative to the number of crews they have competing.

SHALLOW WATER RESCUE PERSONNEL

- a. Competent, skilled surf swimmers (BM proficient) who would be called upon to assist should a shallow water rescue occur.
- b. Please nominate suitable person/s to the Safety and Emergency Management Coordinator if/as requested.

IRB WATER COVER

As per [Circular C22059 Carnival IRB Water Safety Roster](#), Glenelg SLSC to provide driver, crew and radio for the SLSSA IRB for the event.

PHOTOGRAPHERS

- Must have meet the requirements completed the Accreditation Request Form (once per photographer for the season) as per [C22057 – Carnival Club Photographers 22-23](#)
- A maximum of 1 x photographer per Club in any competition area at any one time applies
- Photographers must SIGN ON at the Carnival Admin tent & will receive their accreditation badge and media vest
- They must then SIGN OUT at completion, returning the badge and vest
- Photographers are to comply with Officials' directives regarding positioning etc

ELIGIBILITY & ENTRY

How to enter competitors

Entry Fees

The event entry fee is **included as part of the Senior State Championship entry** which is set at **\$50 (+ GST) per entered competitor**. Please note that the entry fee covers ALL of the state championship events for Under 14 – Open competitors.

Clubs will be invoiced for all entered competitors (including any late entries) following the championships (ie March).

* Reserve active members = 8 hours; Clubs may recognise alternative voluntary service hours & if so, maximum 50% of the minimum required hours can be endorsed as service hours (requires formal endorsement by SLSC Club Board and subsequent advice to SLSSA)
