## ELIGIBILITY & ENTRY

### How to enter competitors

Entries must be submitted via [SEMS](#) (find Senior Carnival 3 – Water Events, Senior Carnival 3- Beach Events)

### Club Volunteers

Clubs are to complete their component of the [Senior Carnival Officials & Volunteer Roster](#) by 12 noon **Wednesday prior to each component** detail volunteer names & other requirements.

### Entry Fees

The carnival entry fee is set at **\$17.50 (incl GST) per entered competitor which includes component A & B.**

Late entry fees may be charged for any entries made after 10am **Wednesday prior to each component.** This fee is set at the entry fee + 100% of entry fee (ie total \$35 incl GST).

Clubs will be invoiced for all entered competitors (including any late entries) following the carnival.

### Eligibility

All eligibility criteria as detailed below **MUST** be achieved **AND** showing in Surfguard by the date of the close of entries (Wednesday prior to each component).

<sup>1</sup> For Under 15 age category members, the award required is Surf Rescue Certificate and/or Bronze Medallion; Proficient is defined as the award expiry date being later than the date of close of entries for the relevant event

<sup>3</sup> For Under 14 age category members this is the Junior Activities Competition Evaluation – Under 14. Other criteria apply (refer Use of SLSSA Equipment Policy 1.02)

**If a member is not showing as eligible in SEMS then there is a problem with either their registration, membership category/competition rights and/or award proficiency.** Please contact us if you have any queries re this.

### Lycra Hi-Vis Vests

The wearing of hi-visibility vests is compulsory for all competitors at this carnival. These can be either fluorescent pink or fluorescent yellow. This requirement extends to craft handlers & Cameron Relay runners.

## CLUB REQUIREMENTS

Officials & Volunteer Roster is to be completed by Clubs by 12noon on the Wednesday prior to each weekend. The following roles are to be filled by Clubs & details provided in the above Roster. (*Roles and Allocations will be made available in the coming days*)

This is a condition of entry.

### 1. Team Manager

- a. Required to attend Team Managers briefing **as advised**
- b. Separate Team Manager/Sweeps briefing will occur in the boat area.

### 2. Officials

Thank you to those officials who have already volunteered for these carnivals. Role allocations have been made accordingly which can be found via the roster

- a. Remaining allocations to be filled by club officials as per rostered allocation (please insert names as appropriate on the roster)
- b. Should wear either an officials shirt (if already have one from previous season) or alternatively sunsmart plain clothing (no club branding). Coloured vests will be available in the designated area for officials to put on over their clothing to denote they are officiating in that particular area
- c. BYO sunsmart hat, water bottle (water will be available in the area to FILL your own drink bottle), sunscreen, clipboard. Those who haven't yet received their officials lanyard pack they will receive these at the carnival.
- d. Morning tea/lunch (Dinner for the Beach component) will be provided but please bring other food if required

### 3. Workparty

Clubs are rostered to undertake work party duties with allocations based on 2021-22 participation numbers. The Clubs required to supply workparty volunteer/s (7.15am – 8.30am for set up + pack up at completion) are:

- COORDINATOR = TBC
- CAN SETTING = rostered IRB crews
- Central Admin Tent/Area = Semaphore x 2
- BEACH CARNIVAL = Grange
- WATER AREAS (Pink + Blue)
  - Brighton x 6

### 4. Under 14 competitors (Water Events)

- Clubs with Under 14 competitors who have NOT yet completed their Surf Rescue Certificate (SRC) are to provide **COMPETENT** water safety personnel (WSP) with their own Rescue Board in the ratio of 1 WSP: 5 competitors.
- These duties can be shared between clubs to ensure the ratio is maintained whilst not overcrowding the water arena with additional craft.
- Please provide details of the number of Under 14s WITHOUT an SRC on the Google Sheets document & ensure your Club meets the above requirements.

## 5. Photographers

- Must have meet the requirements completed the [Accreditation Request Form](#) (once per photographer for the season) as per [C22057 – Carnival Club Photographers 22-23](#)
- The number of photographers per Club is limited to a maximum of 3 at any one time
- A maximum of 1 x photographer per Club in any competition area also applies
- Photographers must SIGN ON at the Carnival Admin tent & will receive their accreditation badge and media vest
- They must then SIGN OUT at completion, returning the badge and vest
- Photographers are to comply with Officials' directives regarding positioning etc

## 6. Shallow Water Rescue personnel (Water Events)

- a. Competent, skilled surf swimmers (BM proficient) who would be called upon to assist should a shallow water rescue occur
- b. List name/s of competent member/s who will be present at the carnival on the volunteer roster (as above)
- c. Will be called for briefing at start of the day

## 7. IRB Water Safety (Water Events)

IRBs – as per [Carnival IRB Water Safety Roster](#), the following Clubs are required to provide 1 x IRB, fully equipped (including fuel and radio), fully operational & competent crew (1 x driver and 1 x crew) who are capable to handle the conditions on the day.

It is strongly encouraged that crews are interchanged during the day - this is the responsibility of the club.

- 1 x South Port
- 1 x West Beach
- 1 x Surf Boat Area (Brighton SLSC to provide driver, crew & radio only).

## 8. Carnival First Aid

The following Clubs are required to provide carnival first aid members

- 2 x Brighton + 2 x West Beach members (29 January- Water events) equipment will be provided
- 2 x Grange (3 February- Beach events)

## WATER SAFETY & RISK MANAGEMENT

The Safety & Emergency Committee will meet prior to the start of the carnival to determine any final procedures regarding water safety and risk management.

Should, at any stage prior to or during competition, there is a credible basis for concluding there is an unreasonable risk of serious injury occurring, the Safety & Emergency Committee and/or appropriate officials shall suspend all or parts of the competition. The Safety & Emergency Committee shall then decide whether to postpone, cancel or relocate all or parts of the competition. Should a risk assessment indicate that part, or all of the competition, not be conducted because of adverse weather or surf conditions, or another threat, the Competition and Safety and Emergency Committees will again decide whether to postpone or cancel all or parts of the competition.
