PLEASE NOTE: No marshalling will be conducted on the days of competition. Only those competitors who marshall (either themselves or via the Team Manager in attendance on Zoom meeting) at the time as above will be included in the event heat draws & therefore permitted to compete.

This process is to ensure that all competitors are aware of when their heat/s are on and to allow for a timely event.

POINTSCORE & MEDALS

All events conducted as part of the Board Riding State Championships will contribute towards the 2024 Senior State Championship point score and pennant, with the exception of the 40 years & over, and 55 years & over events which will contribute towards the 2024 Master State Championship point score and pennant.

NOTE: only those competitors who complete their required 2023-24 registration, award proficiency & patrol hour obligation by 31/12/23 are eligible for medals and scoring points.

Medals will be presented at the Senior and Masters State Championships as appropriate later in the season.

CHAMPIONSHIP JUDGING

The event will be run in accordance with the SLSA Surf Sports Manual (current edition) in conjunction with the 2023 Surfing Australia rule book.

All judges will be Surfing Australia accredited judges.

Live Heats Computer Scoring System will be used for this competition. To access draws, live scores and results will be found https://liveheats.com/SLSSA.

EVENT & WATER SAFETY

Competition risk assessments will be conducted regularly by the Event Leadership Team.

Should, at any stage prior to or during competition, there be a credible basis for concluding there is an unreasonable risk of serious injury occurring, the Event Leadership team shall suspend all or parts of the competition. A decision will then be made as to whether to postpone, cancel or relocate all or parts of the competition. Should a risk assessment indicate that part or all of the competition not be conducted because of adverse weather or surf conditions, or another threat, the Event Leadership Team and/or appropriate officials will again decide whether to postpone or cancel all or parts of the competition.

As the event must be conducted in surf conditions, it is critical that all competitors entering are **capable and sufficiently experienced** to compete in most conditions.

Entry Fees

The event entry fee is set at \$60 (+ GST) per entered competitor. Clubs will be invoiced for all entered competitors following the event.

^{*}Life, Long Service &/or Under 14 members = exempt from patrol hour requirements; Reserve active members = min. 8 hours; Clubs may recognise alternative voluntary service hours & if so, maximum 50% of the minimum required hours can be endorsed as service hours (requires formal endorsement by SLSC Club Board and subsequent advice to SLSSA)
