## **WATER SAFETY & RISK MANAGEMENT**

The Safety & Emergency Committee will meet prior to the start of the carnival to determine any final procedures regarding water safety and risk management.

If, at any stage prior to or during competition, there is a credible basis for concluding there is an unreasonable risk of serious injury occurring, the Safety & Emergency Committee and/or appropriate officials shall suspend all or parts of the competition. The Safety & Emergency Committee shall then decide whether to postpone, cancel or relocate all or parts of the competition. Should a risk assessment indicate that part, or all of the competition, not be conducted because of adverse weather or surf conditions, or another threat, the Competition and Safety and Emergency Committees will again decide whether to postpone or cancel all or parts of the competition.

## **PROGRAMS**

Programs are available on the [Senior Carnival 1- Beach](#) & [Senior Carnival 1 – Water](#) calendar event pages. These are only a guide and team managers & competitors should be prepared if changes to the program are required. Note: U14 & U15s will now race with their own age groups.

## **RACE STARTS & FINISHES**

### Water Event Starts:

Unless otherwise advised, all water events shall be a run start with craft in front of the start line and as close as practicable to the water's edge.

### Water Event Finishes:

Unless otherwise advised, all water events shall be run finish. Handlers are to remove craft and paddles from the course.

The carnival committee will confirm start & finish procedures on the day.

## **RACING FORMAT**

Heats/Finals Format where possible in some instances harsh cuts may be applied depending on time.

## **COMPOSITE TEAMS**

Teams have randomly been pre-assigned based on request made in SEMS. Any adjustments required to these teams will be made at marshalling. This is only applicable for beach carnival.

## **SITE MAPS & TRAILERS**

Site maps will be available on the [Senior Carnival – Water](#) calendar event page when available. Club equipment trailers can be parked on the area shown on the site map.

## **FOOD & DRINK**

### Beach Carnival at Seacliff

## LIVEHEATS

### (Wristbands, Club Caps, Marshalling & Results)

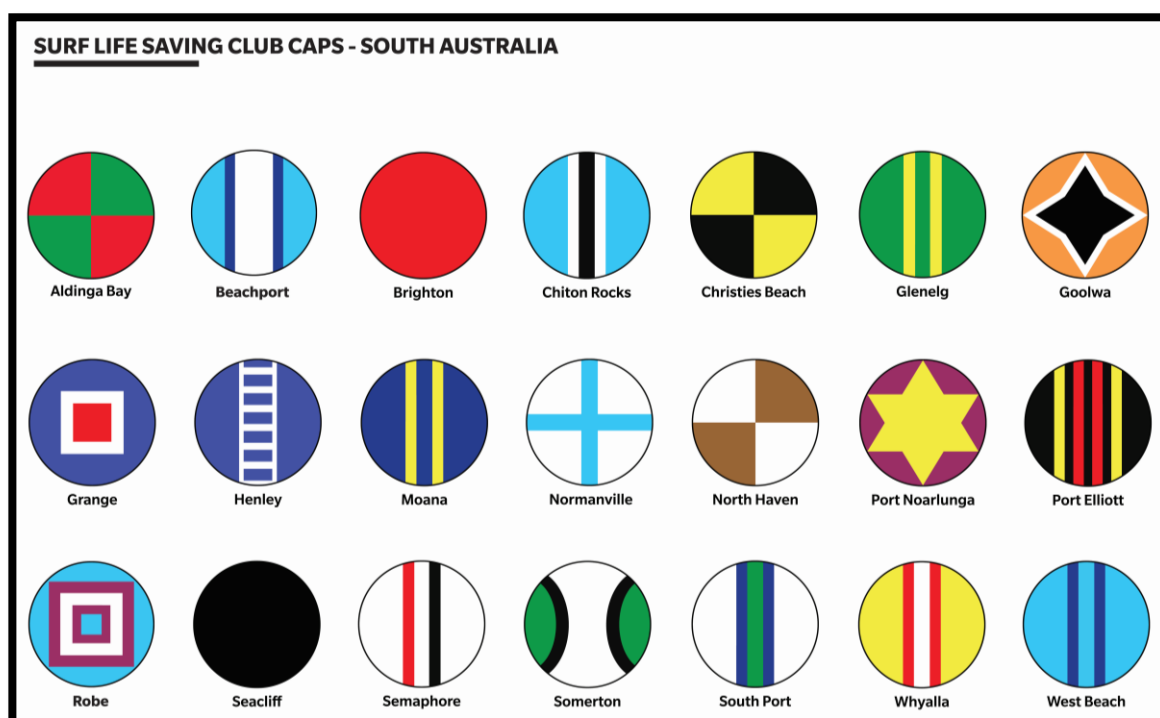
**Wristbands** competitors are required to have a LiveHeats wristband.

- i. if competitors have one from previous events like Aussies, Summer of surf etc they can use those wristbands however should report to admin on arrival to ensure it is working if they were NOT at the recent enduro event.
- ii. If competitors do **NOT** have one, they can collect one from the admin area prior to their first event. Please arrive early and allow enough time to collect.

### Assigning Club caps

Club caps can be assigned to athlete profiles on live heats. Either the clubs or individuals can complete this.

- i. Take a screen shot of the cap, save it, and then upload to each individual athlete profile.



### Marshalling & Recording

- i. Athletes need to take note of the random draw number they have been given for each event. The random draw will be visible on the **LiveHeats** – [Senior Carnival 1 – Beach](#) or [Senior Carnival 1 – Water](#) prior to the weekend. Athletes can also search your name to find your random position once the draws are published. This number will determine your position and heat after marshalling for an event is closed.
- ii. Athletes must arrive to the marshalling area ready to race (Wristband, Club cap, Hi Vis, Craft)
- iii. Athletes on arrival must get their wristband scanned before entering the marshalling pen area. Once in the marshalling pen athletes must stay in the area until called.
- iv. After finished their race athletes wristband will be scanned to record results

## **VOLUNTEER REQUIREMENTS**

### **1. Officials**

- a. Officials have been sourced by SLSSA where possible, any vacate roles have been allocated to clubs via [Officials & Volunteer Roster](#).
- b. Should wear either an officials shirt (if already have one from previous season) or alternatively sunsmart plain clothing (no club branding). Coloured vests will be available at admin for officials to put on over their clothing
- c. BYO sunsmart hat, water bottle (water will be available in the area to FILL your own drink bottle), sunscreen, clipboard, small notepad & pen/pencil

### **2. IRB Water Cover**

- a. Thank you to the following Clubs for their assistance in the provision of IRB water safety:
  - i. Christies Beach x1, Glenelg x1
- b. To provide competent crew capable of setting cans with fully equipped IRB (incl radio)
- c. BYO water bottle & food

### **3. Under 14 competitors**

- Clubs with Under 14 competitors who have NOT yet completed their Surf Rescue Certificate (SRC) are to provide **COMPETENT** water safety personnel (WSP) with their own Rescue Board in the ratio of 1 WSP: 5 competitors.
- These duties can be shared between clubs to ensure the ratio is maintained whilst not overcrowding the water arena with additional craft.
- Please provide details of the number of Under 14s WITHOUT an SRC on the Officials & Volunteers sheet & ensure your Club meets the above requirements.

### **4. Water Safety Personnel**

- a. Club requirement as per roster
- b. Must be proficient SRC or BM members (no more than 50% can be SRC only)
- c. Are to wear SURF RESCUE uniform & have rescue board or tube with them
- d. All water safety personnel will be pre-allocated in the SLS Patrol Ops App – and should report to the Safety officer.

### **5. Shallow Water Rescue personnel**

- a. Competent, skilled surf swimmers (BM proficient) who would be called upon to assist should a shallow water rescue occur
- b. List name/s of competent member/s who will be present at the carnival on the volunteer roster (as above)
- c. Will be called for briefing at start of the day

### **6. Volunteers**

Work Party from 7:45am for set-up. Pack down is also required at the end of the event.

- I. Semaphore x 2
- II. South Port x 2

### **7. Photographer/s**

- a. Please indicate name of Club Photographer/s on the Club team management list.
- b. Must have meet the requirements completed the Accreditation Request Form (once per photographer for the season) as per [C23060 – Carnival Club Photographers 23-24](#)
