Competitors are required to have a LiveHeats wristband. Entry list and draws will be made available [HERE](#)

- i. if competitors have one from previous events like Aussies, Summer of surf etc they can use those wristbands. If not used yet used during the 2023/24 season competitors are welcome to get their wristband checked at the admin tent on arrival.
- ii. If competitors do **NOT** have one or have lost their wristband, they can collect one from the admin area prior to their first event. Note there will be a \$10 charge.

PROGRAMS

RACE STARTS, FINISHES & FORMAT

Water Event Starts: Unless otherwise advised, all water events shall be a traditional race start.

Water Event Finishes: Unless otherwise advised, all water events shall be run finish. Handlers are to remove craft and paddles from the course.

COMPOSITE TEAMS

Composite teams will be allocated on the morning of event after the team managers meeting. Once teams are allocated these teams will be final.

WATER SAFETY & RISK MANAGEMENT

The Safety & Emergency Committee will meet prior to the start of the carnival to determine any final procedures regarding water safety and risk management.

If, at any stage prior to or during competition, there is a credible basis for concluding there is an unreasonable risk of serious injury occurring, the Safety & Emergency Committee and/or appropriate officials shall suspend all or parts of the competition. The Safety & Emergency Committee shall then decide whether to postpone, cancel or relocate all or parts of the competition. Should a risk assessment indicate that part, or all of the competition, not be conducted because of adverse weather or surf conditions, or another threat, the Competition and Safety and Emergency Committees will again decide whether to postpone or cancel all or parts of the competition.

VOLUNTEER REQUIREMENTS

1. Officials

- a. Officials have been sourced by SLSSA where possible, any vacate roles have been allocated to clubs via [Officials & Volunteer Roster](#).
- b. Should wear either an officials shirt (if already have one from previous season) or alternatively sunsmart plain clothing (no club branding). Coloured vests will be available at admin for officials to put on over their clothing
- c. BYO sunsmart hat, water bottle (water will be available in the area to FILL your own drink bottle), sunscreen, clipboard, small notepad & pen/pencil
- d. Officials need to sign in at Admin on arrival.

2. IRB Water Cover

- a. Thank you to the following Clubs for their assistance in the provision of IRB water safety:
 - i. Glenelg x1, West Beach x1
- b. To provide competent crew capable of setting cans with fully equipped IRB (incl radio)
- c. BYO water bottle & food

3. Under 14 competitors

- Clubs with Under 14 competitors who have NOT yet completed their Surf Rescue Certificate (SRC) are to provide **COMPETENT** water safety personnel (WSP) with their own Rescue Board in the ratio of 1 WSP: 5 competitors.
- These duties can be shared between clubs to ensure the ratio is maintained whilst not overcrowding the water arena with additional craft.
- Please provide details of the number of Under 14s WITHOUT an SRC on the Officials & Volunteers sheet & ensure your Club meets the above requirements.

4. Shallow Water Rescue personnel

- a. Competent, skilled surf swimmers (BM proficient) who would be called upon to assist should a shallow water rescue occur
- b. List name/s of competent member/s who will be present at the carnival on the volunteer roster (as above)
- c. Will be called for briefing at start of the day

5. Photographer/s

- a. Please indicate name of Club Photographer/s on the Club team management list.
- b. Must have meet the requirements completed the Accreditation Request Form (once per photographer for the season) as per [C23060 – Carnival Club Photographers 23-24](#)
