

- 1. Structure & format
- 2. Leaders & volunteers
- 3. Communication with families
- 4. Compliance & governance





KEY ROLES...

- 1. Coordinator/Chair
- 2. Administration
- 3. On beach coordinator
- 4. Age Managers Mentor + AGMs based on numbers
- 5. Water Safety Supervisor



REGISTRATIONS...

- 1. MUST have turned 5 years of age (as min) to be registered
- 2. Strongly recommended to be 22-23 registered BEFORE first session
- 3. Probationary members to be changed to relevant category
- 4. Best practice is for min. 1 x parent/carer member with nippers
- 5. No need for additional forms (other than Govt Sports Voucher)

Under 7



- Only as accurate & efficient as the data going in
- Where possible have families include an email address & mobile number on their child's registration
- Encourage families to renew online; ensure pending member requests are checked & approved regularly during start of season



COME & TRY

- 1. Must complete the Waiver (or gather that info required)
- 2. Adequate water safety (> ratios)
- 3. Consider buddy system
- 4. Scheduling to suit local community needs



NIPPER EVALUATIONS

- 1. Preliminary ALL nippers are required to undertake, not just those going to carnivals. Record on Nipper App
- 2. Competition Skills required for those wishing to do swim/board at carnivals. Record on Nipper App



SURF EDUCATION

This is the FUNDAMENTAL program delivered to all U6-U13 nippers at the relevant stage

Delivered by age managers &/or coaches

STAGES not AGES allows flexibility based on ability & entry points

All Surf Ed award completion to be recorded via Nipper App

How to use it?

- Once you've been added to the Age Manager Admin, use your SLS Members Area login to access
- 2. Log attendance (in & out) at each session
- 3. Medical information & notes
- 4. Record preliminary & competition skills evaluations
- 5. Record Surf Ed award completion

Admin officer will 'Publish to Surfguard' regularly





JUNIOR CHAMPION CLUB



The Junior Champion Club is awarded annually to the Club achieving the highest overall score across the 5 pillars of success below

- Clubs will be ranked based on their level of achievement with the highest ranked Club in each pillar being awarded 22 points (2nd highest = 21, 3rd = 20, etc)
- The maximum achievable points is 110 (ie if a Club ranked highest in all 5 pillars; 5 pillars x 22 points)
- Non-participation in any of the pillars will result in 0 points allocated for that pillar/s



MEMBERSHIP RETENTION

Percentage (%) of U6-U13 members retained from previous season.

Club with highest percentage will be ranked highest.

This data will be taken as at 1 February.



CARNIVAL PARTICIPATION

Percentage (%) of U8-U13 members who participated in at least one (1) state junior carnival (11 Dec, 22 Jan, 12 Feb).

Club with highest percentage will be ranked highest.



SPORT PERFORMANCE

Medal tally from all Division 1 events* at State Championships.

Club with most gold medals will be ranked highest.

*Incl events which are not divisional (le march past, RnR, All Agerelays, Champion Lifesaver)



NIPPER PROGRAM

Clubs assessed on 2 factors as percentage of eligible members:

- Preliminary evaluations & Surf Ed awards assessed and recorded* for all U6-U13 members
- 2. Age Managers & program leaders accredited and completed as per annual notification (award, WWCC, SLS Child Safe Awareness training)

Club with highest combined percentage will be ranked highest

*those deemed not yet competent or ineligible to be recorded as such



SPORT PARTICIPATION ENVIRONMENT

Clubs will be scored by Area Referees at Junior Carnivals and State Championships based on their demonstrated appropriate behaviours by participants, leaders/ volunteers and supporters:

- 3 points = exceeded expectation*
- 2 points = met
 expectation
- 1 point = did NOT meet expectation*
- 0 points = blue card issued

Club with highest number of points as at Day 3 State Championships will be ranked highest.

Positive attitudes and conduct make sport more enjoyable for everyone

What is poor sporting behaviour?



Poor behaviour stems from a lack of respect

How do we prevent it?

- 1. Club/organisational management being prepared
- 2. EVERYONE adopting a positive attitude & accepting responsibility for their own behaviour
- 3. Coaches/AGMs/Leaders proactively educating their club families



What are the Do's & Don'ts for Leaders and Age Group Managers



The possible consequences for poor behaviour can include:

- 1. Warning
- 2. Removal from the arena





CARNIVAL PREPARATION

Prior to the carnival...

- Entries
- Volunteer roster
- Equipment

At the carnival...

- Filling all required roles promptly
- Poor behaviour = ZERO tolerance
- Having FUN

CARNIVAL PERSONNEL

Team Manager/s...

- Should have good understanding of rules
- Will be called for any behaviour issues
- Identifiable

Age Managers...

- Limited number as per 21-22
- Strongly encouraged to have gender balance
- Accredited (or in training)
- Identifiable





CARNIVAL PERSONNEL

Officials...

- MUST be accredited or in training
- Clubs will be required to supply on quota basis
- Encourage consistency, essential in key roles
- Youth Officiating team will be developed this season

How to become an official?

Water Safety...

- BM/SRC qualified
- Wear patrol uniform + BYO board/tube
- MUST stay in allocated area
- Sign in/out at central admin
- Clubs rostered for IRB water safety





CARNIVAL PERSONNEL

Photographers...

- MUST have WWCC + NPC (get onto this NOW)
- Submit names of photographers via online form to cover full season
- Sign in/out at central admin

Work Party...

- Will be rostered to assist host clubs as required for set up & pack up
- Must be registered SLSC members (insurance)





CARNIVAL ENTRIES

- 1. Completed via SEMS (authorised officer to have access)
- 2. Any nipper not showing up for entry has an issue with either Registration or Award prerequisite
- 3. Closing date will generally be Tuesday prior to carnival
- 4. Carnival entry fee = \$17.50 pp/carnival (incl GST); State Champs = \$50 pp +gst
- 5. Late entry fees charged accordingly





MEET DIRECTOR APP

- 1. Entries from SEMS are uploaded into the back end of the App via CSV file
- 2. Area Marshall will remove any non-competing entrants from the event as the Age Managers advise them
- 3. Once marshalling completed, the App will create the random draws* for heats (& for subsequent semis, final)
- 4. Results recorded on iPads at finish
- 5. Results are locked once Chief Judge/Referee confirms
